

Workforce Solutions of the Coastal Bend offers Priority of Service to individuals who are:

- Veterans
 - A person who served in the active military, naval, or air service under conditions other than dishonorable.
 - Active services include full-time duty in the National Guard or a Reserve component, other than fulltime for training purposes.
- **Current Foster Youth**
 - A youth, age 14 or older, who is receiving substitute care services under the managing conservatorship of the Texas Department of Family and Protective Services (DFPS), including youth residing in private foster homes, group homes, residential treatment centers, juvenile correctional institutions, and relative care; or

Former Foster Youth


- A youth, up to 24 years of age, who formerly was under the managing conservatorship of DFPS until:
 - A court transferred the conservatorship
 - The youth was legally emancipated the youth's minority status was removed by a court; or
 - The youth attained 18 years of age.
